Here ou can have some Mexican food, beer or tequila, and whatever else you may happen to find interesting. There are many souvinier shops and some of the clubs have interesting floor shows.

The next morning we will head inland. There are mountains of considerable altitude, pine forests, and plenty of desert. We will spend four or five days in this area and then head for home.

If you like hiking and climbing, these activities will be available. If you prefer to go as a sightseer only, this, too, will be possible. The amount of exertion expended will up to the individual with the exception of a certain minimum of time spent in helping with camp chores, food preparations, and travel arrangements.
