YOSEMITE VALLEY, OCTOBER 15 and 16

The fall scheduled trip to The Valley offered many kinds of diversions from the weary, interminable grind of crazy-eights.

Under the leadership of John Faust 30 members and guests of the UCHC enjoyed the forecasted hiking, climbing and studying, and got a bonus of high winds, bold bears, an empty Camp 4 and a smattering of mountain rescue.

Early Saturday morning, following a night of exceptionally high winds, the bears descended on the campground. One of them discovered that the inside of a VW was not designed for bears, and, being of a creative mind, did some redesigning. Later another bear opened the trunk of another car and proceeded to clean it out. The area was cleared of bears that morning, however, when Chuck Pratt, wielding a two-foot knife, chased them back up into the rocks. During the day climbs were made of Arches Terrace, Schultze's Ridge and part of YP Buttress. That night descents were made of Arche's Terrace and part of YP Buttress. Two parties hiked over to the Yosemite Falls trail to Yosemite Point and thence to Snow Creek for the descent into the Valley.

An unfortunate incident emphasized the necessity for the members of any group to not overextend anyone in the group. The second party, leaving only a little before noon, attempted to catch up with the first party. One of the latter was not in the top condition required for such extended, high-speed travel (about 18 miles and nearly 5000 feet total elevation gained) and collapsed on the Snow Creek Trail. A rescue by horseback was lead that night by park ranger Wayne Merry and a short stay in the hospital was required.

Because of two deaths in the campgrounds from trees felled by high winds of Friday night, the park rangers ordered the evacuation of camp 4 Saturday night, another gail being predicted to hit by 6:00 p.m. The evacuation of Camp 4 was efficient and everyone enjoyed the rare phenomenon of Camp 4 without a single living soul or automobile. On returning that night after the evacuation, two climbers sat around in the deserted campground by candle light. Later on a bear found many sleeping bags laid out side by side and carefully walked among them to remove a pack with goodies in it. (He knew the bags must have been empty because the campground had been evacuated.)

On Sunday most people relaxed or studied. A group climbed Sunnyside Bench, another walked (ran?) up Sierra Point, and a third did their relaxing on Monday Morning Slab.

That was all.

TIPS FOR TRIPS

A great deal of emphasis is always given to the skills needed to participate in trip activities, but something that is often overlooked is the need to get along with your fellow trip members. An otherwise enjoyable trip can be easily spoiled by needless personal irritations. Most of these can be avoided by having a little consideration for the convenience of those who are with you on a trip. The following suggestions may be helpful.

1. Bring what you need for the trip. Be sure you have enough food and money to cover the entire trip, and bring the equipment you'll need for trip activities. Don't depend on others to supply you, unless arrangements are made in advance.

2. Pack it properly. Use containers which will fit easily into the car trunk. Cloth bags or knapsacks are best--avoid paper bags, boxes, suitcases, and excessively large bundles.

3. Be on time. Be ready to leave on the trip or on trip activities at the prearranged time, even if you must inconvenience yourself to do so. Pack a day early if necessary--not at the last minute. At the campsite, do not take all morning, to roll up your sleeping bag and to eat breakfast, particularly when others are waiting for you.

4. Do your share. Volunteer to help with community chores. If you're eating food from a group commissary, you should help cook it or do some of the dishwashing. Do your share of the driving, rope coiling, carrying of equipment, etc.

5. Don't depend on others. People are glad to help you if you really need help. Don't waste your friends' time because of your laziness or lack of organization.

6. Take things as they come. Accept changes of plan with good grace and yield to the will of the majority. Don't let bad weather or other discomforts spoil your trip, laugh it off and realize that everyone else is in the same boat and that it's only temporary.

7. Above all, remember these three basic principles:
- a. Be well-organized.
 - b. Be self-sufficient.
 - c. Be considerate.

BEGINNING CAVE TRIP

The first cave trip of the fall term got under way - late, as usual. But leader Tom Aley finally arrived and fourteen people, packed into Tom's truck and Jerry Connors' Renault, left for the Mother Lode. We arrived at Cave City Cave, near San Andreas, in time for an early lunch. After the general confusion involved in changing into old cave clothes, filling carbide lamps and gathering equipment, we trooped through the large, cool entrance into the cave. People then wandered off to explore in independent groups.

We were assured that the cave really wasn't muddy, but most of us weren't so sure. Before long, tennis shoes were pulled off, and clothes and hands were covered by a suspiciously muddy-like substance.

The cave is well known, and much vandalism has occurred. There are still many of the larger formations, such as stalactites, stalagmites and draperies. The delicate helictites and other fragile formations remain only far back in the cave. The cave, the largest known in the Mother Lode, consists of several large rooms with lots of passages off each. Some of the more ambitious explorers tried to see every nook of the whole cave; many of the more timid simply tried to keep oriented; some spent considerable time trying to squeeze through a little hole. In any case, cavers kept very active in the vast blackness.

After several hours, the tired and muddy cavers trickled out into the bright afternoon. We attempted to clean up and then finished off lunches. It was an enjoyable trip for old-timers and initiates alike. We headed back to Berkeley after a Saturday well spent.

BIKE HIKE

A UCHC cycling excursion on the Monterey Coast calls all adventurers the weekend of October 29-30. The trip, led by Martin J. Zonlight, LA 4-2461, will cover about 15 miles of Highway 1 north of Big Sur State Park along part of California's rugged coast. All comers may expect enthralling views of blue sky and crashing surf.
